- Principal's Report
  - Budget Paradox: DOE looks at class sizes, not programming- want us to collapse classes and place students in other classes, but this doesn't work with DL
  - Parents need to understand the implications of not meeting our fundraising goal, how it could potentially impact them
    - Draft letter- needs to be clear as to how the money we raise is allocated and the need for each position
    - Revisions- decide how to explain to parents how money is allocated and how PTA can raise money (in a way that benefits the whole school, not a particular class program)
    - Vote to share with school community- finalize the letter with parent and teacher input
  - Professional Development Update
    - D3 Instructional Coach on Reading First NYC
      - Data and small group instruction- Dreambox reading is delayed due to DOE tech issues/vetting
    - Teaching Matters for Math
    - Wit and Wisdom
    - PROSE
- PTA Report
  - Successful Fundraisers- Fun Run broke records (55K) and welcomed new families at the same time, Movie Night had strong attendance, Fall Fair tomorrow 10/25 and hoping for a strong turnout



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- Voted for a VP of Fundraising, but parent can't commit to the time needed, so this will be split between parents as a team effort
- Family Giving Campaign to start mid-November so it's important to have the letter about the budget ready so parents understand the needs and consequences of fundraising
- The need for books in DL programs- to access new curriculum materials in Spanish and French, there was an event to inform parents of the needs
- After School Report
  - Successful trial PROSE day, launched the rest of the days for enrollment
  - The longer format day was exciting
  - Day camps running at 163 for student non-attendance days

  - Annual Review of PS84's Mission Statement
    - Current Mission statement
      - "The Lillian Weber School strives to provide equity and access for all learners. 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
